WOLFHOUND PACK NEWS

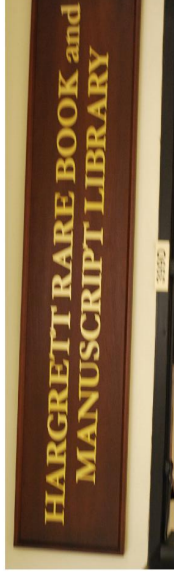

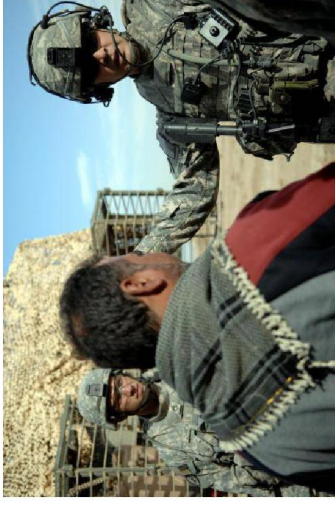
HOLY FAMILY HOME

Since its activation in 1901 at Plattsburg Barracks, New York, the 27th Infantry Regiment has served the United States. The Regiment served in the Philippines during the Philippine Insurrection, 1902 to 1904. While serving in Siberia in 1918 the Regiment earned its nickname, "The Wolfhounds," because of its aggressive pursuit of retreating Bolshevik forces. In 1921, the Wolfhounds were permanently posted to Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. In 1941, they became a part of the 25th Infantry Division. The Wolfhounds have since served in WWII, the Pacific; in the occupation of Japan; Korea; Vietnam; Panama; Iraq; and Afghanistan.
